## Bill Gates Funded Lab, Less Than 2 Miles From Wuhan Institute, Reports Cholera Case

Wuhan Institute of Virology researchers have buried troves of data pertinent to COVID-19. Meanwhile the <u>Bill Gates-funded lab, less than</u> 2 miles away from the <u>Wuhan Institute</u>, has reported a cholera case.



According to media sources, a case of cholera has been detected at Wuhan University, which is under the control of the Chinese Communist Party.

The Wuhan Institute of Virology, which is thought by many scientists and government intelligence officials to be the origin of COVID-19, is situated in the same province as Wuhan University, which is less than

two miles away. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation has also donated about \$750,000 to the university.

To "establish international research networks and data sharing platforms as well as develop policy recommendations for improving the medical insurance system in China," the institution received \$499,944 from the vaccine advocate's organization in November 2018. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation sent the institution an additional \$127,650 in January 2021, despite the Chinese Communist Party having deliberately concealed material pertinent to the COVID-19's genesis. This money was used to support research into increasing access to anti-tuberculosis medications.

The district's health administration asserts that after a student from Wuhan University was diagnosed with the illness, samples were gathered, contact tracing was done, and several locations were shut down for disinfection.

Health officials for the Chinese Communist Party assert that no new cases have been reported.

Cholera is a highly contagious disease that can be transmitted through contaminated food or water and causes acute diarrhea. The event at Wuhan University is unusual, as only one other case has been reported in China this year, while five were discovered last year.

The event comes after the Wuhan Institute of Virology was heavily criticized for its role in the origins of COVID-19, as the lab modified bat coronavirus strains to make them more harmful to humans.

Wuhan Institute of Virology researchers have buried troves of data pertinent to COVID-19, similar to the characteristics of gain-of-function research, which was formerly outlawed in the United States because of its dangerous nature.

Anthony Fauci has given millions of dollars to these same researchers, including "Bat Lady" Shi Zhengli.
